Overview:

Silver Lake Nature Center is looking for an energetic and creative individual to teach our 2019 Summer Camp. This educator will work with the 6 to 12 year old campers. This is a nature-based camp that is both educational and fun. The camp itself will run for 9 weeks from June 24 to August 23, from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm with extended care. This position would be a full day from 8:30 am until 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday for the 9 camp weeks. Additional week of counselor training just prior to camp required, June 17 to June 21 from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm.

Qualifications:

- ✓ At least 2 years of College; degree completion a plus
- ✓ Background in environmental science and/or education preferred
- ✓ Lifeguard certification a plus
- ✓ Ability to work well with others
- ✓ Experience working with children
- ✓ Ability to sustain high energy levels and positive attitude throughout the camp
- ✓ Passion for the mission of Silver Lake Nature Center (SLNC) which is to inspire connections with nature for people of all ages, interests, and abilities through education, recreation, preservation, research, and advocacy.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- ✓ Keep calm during stressful situations
- ✓ Plan and implement lesson plans for the 6-12 year old age group
- ✓ Oversee and participate in environmental education programs for children
- ✓ Help supervise campers and children during before care hours
- ✓ Supervise Counselors-In-Training (CIT's) assigned to your group
- ✓ Lead interpretative hikes on our trails, arts and crafts activities, and cooperative games and sports
- ✓ Maintain an organized and clean workspace, including supply closets, office, and areas used by campers
- ✓ Be prompt with shift times, which are 8:00 am-4:30 pm Monday through Friday
- ✓ Be present for all 9 weeks of camp

Remuneration for position: \$500 stipend per week. Housing available onsite.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly required to stand, walk, talk and hear.
